### Interim Pastor's Article

God is Good! All the Time! And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. Romans 8:28 (NIV)

Recently, while leading a worship service in Quincy, a gentleman in the congregation collapsed. We had just finished the last hymn when I looked up and saw him slumped over the pew in front of him. You know how things can move in slow motion during a crisis. I remember trying to process what I was seeing – a few

men moving to assist – a woman dialing 911. Then men gently lifting the man, laying him on the floor. What was probably only seconds seemed like an eternity. I heard someone say "he is responsive" answering a question from the 911 dispatcher. I remember seeing his wife with head bowed in prayer, and another woman embracing her. I remember seeing the shocked faces of those in attendance. I watched as a doctor from the group dropped to the man's side. A pastor friend was holding his head up off the floor to make laying a bit more comfortable. I remember rolling up my coat to stick under his head and when I did, I saw how ashen he looked. Had he not been talking, I would have thought he had died. The ambulance arrived and he was taken to Blessing Hospital.

Later that evening, a post on Facebook stated that his vitals were fine and they would keep him overnight for observation. The next morning, word came that they were keeping him for a heart catherization scheduled for the next day. A later post stated that during the heart cath they placed two stents opening two blockages, one 90% and the other 95%. Praise God!

I was reminded of two lessons from this event. First, God's timing is always perfect. Had the man passed out 30 minutes later, he would have been driving home and the results would have been much different. Had he not passed out at all, the blockages could have resulted in a fatal heart attack. I am always in awe of God's timing. What seemed like a crisis at the moment was really a blessing in disguise.

The second lesson reminds me of Romans 8:28, *And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.* Again, what seemed like a crisis at the time, God used for good. I saw the man a few days after his release from the hospital. I asked how he was feeling. With a big smile on his face he said, "I didn't know how bad I really felt."

Sometimes we see "the good" shortly after the crisis as in this situation. Sometimes the good comes a week, a month, even years after. Sometimes the good doesn't come during our lifetime but after. Yet how comforting it is to know that God takes our darkest nights, our deepest valleys, and uses them for good and his glory. Thanks be to God!


### Journey of Stones

We have been using our down time not only to promote and invite people and ministries to come stay with us, but also to practice our coaching skills and debriefing on our missionary friends in Athens and elsewhere. We continue to learn and prepare, which has included taking an on-line counseling-type course. Through this course God has been helping us to see the wrong belief systems we have and how easily we can make wrong assumptions, based on false beliefs, that lead to unhealthy actions. Being transformed by the renewing of our minds with His truth is key to loving ourselves, living in healthy relationships, serving others and loving God. **Please pray** our minds will be renewed by Him even more!

Locally, in our area we have joined a small Bible study with a few believers and hope to see it grow as we discover more believers in the area. **Please pray** for this to grow as there is no evangelical church witness within a 20 mile radius of us. 
