Words from Pastor Jon

Well, we have made it to the last month of the Gregorian calendar year again. December in our culture is associated with the height/bedlam of the holiday season. Yet, in universal Christian tradition, the church year starts with the first Sunday of Advent, which is December 1st this year.

This tradition of Advent may have started as early as the 4th century AD but it really did not take the standard form it takes today until the Medieval period. Advent season is built on the ideas of remembering the Messiah's first coming and anticipating the Messiah's second coming. These are balanced during the Advent weeks leading up to the celebration of the miracle of the incarnation celebrated on Christmas Eve and/or Christmas Day.

So easily in our 21st century culture, we can find ourselves overwhelmed by the seeming pandemonium of the holiday season. Advent worship services can be wonderful times of reflection, remembrance, and anticipation of God's Kingdom being ultimately fulfilled in our world. As one Christian curriculum describes Advent spirituality beautifully by saying something like: "When the Church celebrates the ritual of Advent each year, we make present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their fervent desire for the Savior's second coming. By celebrating the forerunner's birth and martyrdom, followers of Jesus unite themselves with John the Baptist's desire: 'He must increase, but I must decrease.'"

May we all take this valuable time of year to remember the power of waiting and watching as we strive to grow closer to Jesus.


