## Search Committee Update

After Pastor Wally announced his January 2017 retirement, the search committee was chosen by the congregation to represent it in the search for our congregation's next pastor. This is a highly confidential, highly focused, and time intensive process that has been taken very seriously by the search committee. We respect the trust invested in us to represent the entire church's interest in this selection process. In this past month of April, the committee has found a candidate we believe God has specially chosen to shepherd our congregation as our next pastor.

This past month, the Search Committee had a Neutral Pulpit with this pastoral candidate, and discerned God's choice of this candidate for our church. With the candidate's mutual discernment, we began the process of preparing a recommendation to the congregation to call this candidate. The committee has scheduled the candidate to visit the congregation for the weekend of May 4th and 5th. There is a candidate introduction meeting on Saturday May 4th at 1:00pm that is open to church members and regular-attending-non-members. On Sunday May 5th, the candidate will lead our regular worship service. Following the service there will be a special business meeting for the church members to vote to accept or reject the search committee's recommendation to call this pastoral candidate. If the membership votes to accept the search committee's recommendation, the candidate will then have the opportunity to accept or reject the congregation's call.

The search committee has distributed a Prayer Journey for your use every day leading up to the May 4th and 5th weekend. No matter our best intentions, the principalities of this world wish to thwart them. We must lean on Christ the entire way, and He will guide our footsteps. Please be in prayer over the church, the candidate and his family, and the search committee as we come together for an event that will prove to be an important historical moment. And also pray for God's direction in moving us forward as we grow faithfully in body, mind, and spirit (Col 3:1-4; 1 Thes 5:23).

For the past several years, I've attended the Federation of American Baptist Musicians' annual conference held each July at our denomination's conference center in Green Lake, Wisconsin. If you've been up there, you know it is Holy Ground. It probably comes as no surprise that we begin each

day of the conference with worship. As I arrived for worship one morning, there was a table in the entrance filled with colorful construction paper, pens and the following instructions:

Please take a piece of construction paper. Write on it a name, word, or phrase that describes God. Here are some possibilities: Holy, Love, Mother, Father, Creator, Ground of All Being, Ultimate Concern, Source, Surprising, Wonderful Counselor, Almighty, Everlasting, Emmanuel. Caring, Forgiving, Good, Unpredictable, Light, Redeemer, Just, Life, Great, Living, God of Abraham, God of Isaac, God of Jacob, I AM, (your own word or phrase)

On the back of the paper is a stanza number for the hymn "Bring Many Names." As we sing that stanza, please bring your paper forward and lay it on the table at the front of the room, then return to your seats.

As I finished writing my phrase a woman came up behind me and said in a rather loud voice: "What is this? I don't go for this monkey business" I was stunned. I grieved for God and I hurt for the woman.

Then I wondered, is this ever my attitude when I come to worship? Is this my attitude when something unexpectedly changes? Or when something new is introduced? Or when the worship order changes? Or when traditions are discontinued? When have I also said: "What is this monkey business?" And how about you? Have you been there? Can you relate?

The Psalmist wrote "enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name." During the upcoming Sundays, may we do just that. May we come with attitudes of thanksgiving and praise. May we come with hearts and minds wide open to received all the wonders God has in store for us. May we eagerly pick up the pen and write a phrase describing God with an anticipation of what is to follow. May we come ready to worship the one worthy of our worship.




